Councilman Palmer extended an invitation to the Community to attend the Memorial Day service held on Monday, May 27, 2019 at Veterans Park. The program will begin at 9:00 a.m. with the Honorable Trent Kelly, Congressman, 1CD-MS and BG, MSARNG, as the keynote speaker.

Councilwoman Nettie Y. Davis thanked the individuals who made the recent purchase of the old Mr. Quick building located on North Green Street possible. Plans are in place to repurpose the building to benefit the Park Hill Community.

Councilwoman Davis offered her gratitude and thanks to philanthropist Robert Smith. On May 19, 2019, private equity billionaire, Robert F. 

Only the City of Tupelo Mayor and City Council has the ability to adopt any revisions to the policies in this handbook.

I understand and agree that nothing in the Employee Handbook creates, or is intended to create, a promise or representation of continued employment and that employment at the City of Tupelo is employment at-will, which may be terminated at the will of either the City or myself. Furthermore, I acknowledge that this handbook is neither a contract of employment nor a legal document. I understand and agree that employment and compensation may be terminated with or without cause and with or without notice at any time by the City of Tupelo or myself.

#### **302 Bereavement Leave**

Employees who wish to take time off due to the death of an immediate family member should notify their supervisor immediately.

Regular full-time employees will receive up to three (3) days of paid bereavement leave

Members of the Fire Department will receive twenty-four (24) work hours of paid bereavement leave due to the nature of the shift work.

Bereavement pay is calculated based on the base pay rate at the time of absence.

Bereavement leave will normally be granted unless there are unusual business needs or staffing requirements. Employees may, with their supervisors' approval, use any available paid leave for additional time off as necessary.

For purposes of this policy, "immediate family" means spouse, mother, father, mother-in-law, father-inlaw, children, sister, brother, daughter-in-law, son-in-law, brother-in-law, sister-in-law, grandparents, (add language to clarify grandparent of spouse is immediate family for example grandparent-in-law") and grandchildren. Current step-grandparents, stepchildren, stepfather, stepfather-in-law, niece nephew, or cousin, who resides in your household or over whom you are a court appointed guardian or conservator might also be treated as "immediate family."

#### **315 Donation of Leave**

Any City of Tupelo employee may donate a portion of his or her earned personal leave, vacation and/or sick leave to another employee who is suffering from a catastrophic illness or injury, or to another employee who has a member of his or her immediate family who is suffering from a catastrophic illness or injury, in accordance with the following (Language Does not comply with sick leave policy)

- 1. The employee donating the leave (the "donor employee") shall designate the employee who is to receive the leave (the "recipient employee") and the amount of earned vacation and/or sick leave that is to be donated, and shall notify the donor employee's department head of his or her designation. The donor employee's department head shall then notify the recipient employee's department head of the amount of leave that has been donated by the donor employee to the recipient employee. The recipient employee's department head must receive approval from the Personnel Department for the donated leave.
- 2. The maximum amount of earned leave that an employee may donate to any other employee may not exceed a number of days which would leave the donor employee fewer than seven (7) days of vacation leave. The maximum amount of earned sick leave an employee may donate to any other employee may not exceed fifty percent (50%) of the earned sick leave of the donor employee. An employee who retires from employment with the City of Tupelo may donate all accrued vacation and sick leave
- 3. An employee must have exhausted all of his or her earned vacation and sick leave before he or she will be eligible to receive any leave donated by another employee.
- 4. Before an employee may receive donated leave, he or she must provide his or her department head and the Human Resources Department with a physician's statement that states the beginning date of the catastrophic illness or injury, a description of the illness or injury, a prognosis for recovery and an anticipated date that the recipient employee will be able to return to work.
- 5. If the total amount of leave donated to any employee is not used by the recipient employee, the donated leave will be returned to the donor employees on a pro rata basis, based on the ratio of the number of days of leave donated by each donor employee to the total number of days of leave donated by all employees.
- 6. For purposes of this policy, "immediate family" means spouse, child, stepchild, parent, stepparent, parent-in-law or sibling. (Delete to comply with revision request)

#### RESOLUTION AMENDING THE CITY OF TUPELO EMPLOYEE HANDBOOK ACKNOWLEDGMENT AND POLICIES 302 - BEREAVEMENT LEAVE AND 315 - DONATION OF LEAVE

WHEREAS, on March 19, 2019 the City of Tupelo City Council adopted a City of . Tupelo Employee Handbook; and

WHEREAS, the Acknowledgment of the Employee Handbook cites a link for the employee to access said Handbook online; and

WHEREAS, the link is no longer utilized or accessible to city employees and the City wishes to delete it from the Acknowledgment; and

WHEREAS, Section 309 - Bereavement Leave of said Employee Handbook establishes

bereavement leave for an employee upon the death of an immediate family member; and

WHEREAS, the City wishes to modify and expand the definition of immediate family to include the grandparent of a spouse.

WHEREAS, Section 315 – Donation of Leave of said Handbook establishes criteria for a donation of leave between employees and Number Six (#6) of Policy 315 defines the term "immediate family"; and

WHEREAS, Number 6 of the Donation of Leave Policy does not comply with our sick leave policy and therefore should be removed from Policy 315.

**THEREFORE LET IT BE RESOLVED** by the City Council of the City of Tupelo as follows:

- 1. The prefatory paragraphs of this Resolution are hereby found and determined to be necessary and in the best interest of the public health and welfare of the City of Tupelo.
- 2. The Acknowledgment shall be modified to delete the link to the Employee Handbook that is no longer accessible to employees.

3. The last paragraph of Policy 302 – Bereavement Leave shall be amended by substituting the following language:

"For purposes of this policy, "immediate family" means spouse, child, stepchild, parent, step-parent, parent of spouse, sibling, sibling of spouse, grandparent and grandparent of spouse"

4. The first unnumbered paragraph of this Policy shall read:

"Any City of Tupelo employee may donate a portion of his or her earned personal leave, vacation and/or sick leave to another employee who is suffering from a catastrophic illness or injury."

And 315.6 shall be deleted.

#### TUPELO PLANNING COMMITTEE

#### May 6, 2019

#### CALL TO ORDER

Chairman Mack-Arthur Turner Jr. called the meeting to order. Other members present were Mr. Gus Hildenbrand, Mr. Scott Davis, Mr. Bill Smith, Mrs. Patti Thompson, Mr. Ted Moll, Mr. Eddie Armstrong, Mr. Christian Reed, and Leslie Mart. Mr. Smith provided the invocation and Mr. Reed led the Pledge of Allegiance. Staff present were Pat Falkner and Marilyn Vail of the Development Services Department.

#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Hildenbrand made a motion to approve the minutes of the March 4 meeting. The motion was seconded by Mr. Smith and approved by unanimous vote.

#### REPORT OF COUNCIL ACTION

Mr. Falkner reported that the council had accepted the March 4 minutes at their April 2 meeting, and that the Feemster Lake Road rezoning was finalized April 16.

Mr. Turner stated that the Committee had been asked to move the first new business item up ahead of the old business to allow Councilman Willie Jennings to hear that discussion and still attend a neighborhood meeting.

#### NEW BUSINESS

**FLEXVAR 19-03:** application from Joe Earp on behalf of Mill Creek to construct two congregate living 1 homes less than 2,500 feet from each other.

Mr. Joe Earp, Director of Supervised Living for Mill Creek, 1445 Nesbit Drive, Hernando MS, appeared on behalf of the application. He said that Mill Creek has 15 locations in DeSoto County where they provide residential services for adults with mental and physical disabilities. These are not people with mental health problems, but people who are over 21 years old and need to live in a setting outside their families. The company plans to construct two four bedroom, three bath homes on the property at the intersection of Highway 278 and Southern Heights Road. The homes will have garages and the vehicle used to transport residents would be kept in the garage, with no more than two vehicles on site. The residents would be in a day program from 7:30 to 3, with staff in the home at all times when residents are there.

Ms. Mart asked if the homes would be coed. Mr. Earp said no, that men and women would be housed separately. Residents would be encouraged to be in bedrooms by 10 on weeknights and 12 on weekends. The day program is located on Wilson Street and includes skills training, job coaching, money management and community integration activities.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

<u>FLEXVAR18-03</u> Application from Mr. Jason Price for a Flexible Variance to build a 1,200 square feet accessory building on his property at 142-146 Traceview.

This application was originally heard in August 2018 and was tabled while the Code Enforcement staff dealt with conditions on the property.

Jason Price spoke on behalf of the application, saying that his property was located on a dead end road where most of the other properties have storage buildings that exceed the city's size limits.

Mr. Turner asked Mr. Falkner if the staff was satisfied with the applicant's progress in removing junk vehicles and other violations on the property. Mr. Falkner said that they were.

Mr. Davis asked Mr. Price if he still planned on removing the old shed once the new building is complete; Mr. Price said that he did.

Ms. Mart asked if the building would have plumbing or HVAC that would allow it to become a rental space. Mr. Price said it would not, there would be water and power but no residential type fixtures.

Mr. Davis said that as Mr. Price had reduced the size of the requested building and complied with code enforcement, it was appropriate to recognize the standards of the area. He moved to approve the application. Ms. Mart seconded and the motion passed with all voting in favor.

#### **OTHER BUSINESS**

<u>MAJSUB19-03</u> Application for a new five lot commercial subdivision on West Main Street across from Ballard Park.

Justin Davis, 2808 St. Andrews Drive, spoke on the application. He explained that it was to subdivide an 8 acre tract at West Main Street and Rutherford Road into five or more commercial lots.

Ms. Mart asked if the lots would have direct access onto Main Street. Mr. Davis said that most of the lots would not, with the subdivision designed to use existing points of access at Rutherford Road and Venture Drive rather than new driveways, except for the lot at the west end of the development. Ms. Mart asked Mr. Falkner if the proximity of the site to Ballard Park and Parkway Elementary School would limit what could be located there. Mr. Falkner responded that a restaurant serving beer might be affected, but since the separation distance for this requirement is measured from building to building it did not appear likely to have an impact.

Ms. Mart asked if the lot lines shown were firm. Mr. Falkner explained that with commercial subdivisions, the practice has been to allow the developer flexibility in recording lots according to demand as long as the overall form of the subdivision is maintained and lots meet minimum dimensions.






